Focus:

Cutting fundamentals, client preparation, sectioning, angle control, disconnection, styling reveal, troubleshooting, and evaluation.

Assessment approach:

Ongoing tutor observation, questioning, peer review, practical checks, short written knowledge checks, and final practical outcome review.

Safety emphasis:

Hygiene, tool sterilisation, personal protective equipment, consultation, and contraindication checks.

Overall intent:

To translate disconnected cutting theory into manageable, chronological teaching units with clear delivery, timing, and assessment methods across four weeks.

Session	Topic	Learning Objective(s)	Lesson Activities	Resources
Week 1, Session 1	Introduction to disconnected cutting and core cutting principles	Learners will understand what a disconnected cut is, why it is used, and how it differs from solid, graduated and layered forms. They will identify the role of angles, sectioning, weight distribution, movement, and length separation.	75 minutes: 10 mins — Tutor introduction to the unit, expected standards, and assessment methods. 15 mins — Guided discussion on what “disconnection” means in hairdressing; tutor uses visual examples and sketches of long top/short sides, disconnected fringe, and internal disconnection.	Whiteboard, slides, haircut diagrams, visual references, handouts, pens, highlighters.
